



Gospel — The shepherds glorified and praised God for all they had heard and seen (Luke 2:16-21).



Saint Gregory Nazianzen: patriarch of Constantinople; noted for his knowledge of sacred Scripture; called theologus for his outstanding teaching abilities and eloquence. "Give something, however small, to the one in need. For it is not small to one who has nothing. Neither is it small to God, if we have given what we could."



Thursday, January 5. Saint John Neumann:

missionary from Bohemia; bishop of Philadelphia; known for his holiness and learning; promoter of parochial schools; authored two German catechisms; first American bishop canonized. "As Christ has His work, we too have ours; as He rejoiced to do His work, we must rejoice in ours also."



Tuesday, January 3. **Most Holy Name of Jesus:** In the Middle Ages, IHS was widely used by the Franciscans, and in the Catholic Reformation (the period of



Catholic reform that began in 1543 with the Council of Trent), the Jesuits interpreted IHS as Iesum Habemus Socium ("We have Jesus as our Companion").

Wed, January 4. **Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton**: raised Episcopalian; wife and mother of five children;

foundress of the first congregation for women religious in USA, the Sisters of Charity, devoted primarily to the education of the poor and to teaching in parochial schools; first native-born citizen canonized. "Faith lifts the soul, Hope supports it, Experience says it must and Love says...let it be!



Friday, January 6. **Saint Andre Bessette:** orphaned at age twelve; spent four years in the US as a mill

worker; known as a healer and the "Miracle Man of Montreal" where he founded the Oratory of St. Joseph, to whom he was dedicated and fostered devotion; over one million people paid their respects at his death; patron of caregivers. "The sufferings that the good Lord sends us are like the visits



that the good Lord likes to make to his best friends."

Grow in love for God this New Year

The more we know God, the more we love him. It naturally follows because of who he is. But we cannot love someone we do not know. When making New year's resolutions, consider adding, a plan for deepening your knowledge of God. LEARN AND STUDY OUR FAITH. The Catholic Church leads us to God and we have two millennia of inspired Church teaching to help. For a start, the prayers and

readings at Mass remind us of what we know about God. To go deeper, we can turn to the works of many reliable Catholic authors. For example, *The Catholic Way* by Cardinal Donald W. Wuerl, uses easy-to-understand language to explain many wonderful aspects of our doctrine and practice. PRAY CONSTANTLY. The better we

know God, the more time we will want to spend with him but life can interfere with formal prayer. Pope Benedict once said, "Offer everything you do to the Lord, ask his help in all the circumstances of daily life and remember that he is always beside you." Make prayer a constant, two-way conversation with God. Choose JOY OVER HAPPINESS. Happiness comes from

pursuing the rewards of this world. Joy is pursuing those of the next. Happiness never lasts. Joy lasts forever but can only come from knowing and loving God.


