born in Lima, Peru of Spanish father and a black slave mother; lay brother who humbly ministered to the poor and the sick, especially African slaves; devoted to the Holy Eucharist; a close friend of St. Rose of Lima; patron of social justice and the peoples of mixed races.

Friday, November 4. Saint Charles Borromeo: cardinal and secretary of state at age twenty-two for his uncle, Pope Pius IV; implemented reforms of Trent in his diocese of Milan; founder of seminaries; considered a model pastor by many bishops; held five provincial councils and eleven diocesan synods; patron of catechist and of catechumens.

A Note from Fr. George

All the Faithful Departed – NOVEMBER 2

Prayers for the dead were an ancient tradition, even in some pagan cultures. In Jewish Scriptures, Judas Maccabeus “made atonement for the dead” (2 Mc 12:46), and early Christians inscribed prayers for their dead in Rome’s catacombs. Local Catholic churches began remembering all the faithful departed in the early Middle Ages, with a Spanish feast from the time of St. Isidore of Seville, who died in 636. The fixed November date is generally attributed to St. Odilio of Cluny, who decreed in 998 that all monasteries under the Cluny rule should sing the Office of the Dead the day after the feast of All Saints. This custom gradually spread throughout Europe and was adopted by Rome in the 13th century. Today, **All Souls’ Day** is a profound expression of our faith in the communion of saints—the bond of love that unites the Church on earth, the souls in purgatory, and the saints in heaven. On this day, Catholics everywhere are encouraged to pray for their deceased loved ones, visit cemeteries, offer Masses for the repose of their souls, entrusting them to God’s merciful love.

All Saints Day is November 1. It celebrates the saints who have tread paths to Heaven before us. No matter what your interest, profession, or situation in life, there is a saint to whom you can relate and follow to Heaven. **November 1 falls on Saturday this year, obligation to attend Mass is abrogated, or lifted; it is not a Holy Day of Obligation .**

Because we know death is not the end of life, we as Christians visit graves of our loved ones who have died. From November 1 to 8, we Catholics can receive a plenary indulgence for souls in purgatory by visiting a cemetery, praying for the dead. Plenary indulgence is a special grace that removes all punishment due to sin for those in purgatory.

To receive the indulgence, you must:

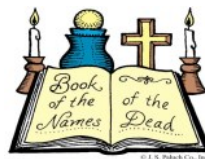


- Be in a state of grace
- Go to confession w/in 20 days
- Receive Holy Communion
- Pray for the Pope's intentions
- Have the intention to gain the indulgence

You may wish to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. Votive Candles

The light signifies our prayer offered in faith coming into the light of God. With the light of faith, we petition our Lord in prayer, or petition a saint to pray with us and for us to the Lord. The continually burning flame symbolizes ongoing nature of the prayer even after the person who lit the candle has left church. Candles may be lit for loved ones who have died, in gratitude, supplication or any other intention. A small donation is requested to offset cost of candle.
