


Saint Denis, Companions, Martyrs: first bishop of Paris; patron of Paris and of France.; was beheaded in Paris in the year 250. According to legend, angels accompanied him as he carried his own head from the place of execution to his chosen burial site, where later church of Saint Denis was built just outside Paris.

Monday, October 9

Saint John Leonardi: founded Congregation of Clerics Regular of Mother of God; published compendium of Christian doctrine; cofounded with St. Philip Neri Collegio Urban which, under the direction of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples, trains priests for the foreign missions.



BEARING THE RIGHT KIND OF FRUIT

Today's readings focus our attention on vineyards. Isaiah's song concerning his friend's vineyard begins with inspiring and poetic images of an idyllic vineyard where choicest harvest is expected. Instead, the vineyard yields wild grapes, which causes the owner to abandon it. The psalmist cries out to God, asking that God once again take care of the vineyard, which is the house of Israel. The parable told in today's Gospel offers a stern warning that those who commit treachery in the hopes of attaining personal wealth will be "put . . . to a wretched death" (Matthew 21:41). Jesus warns his listeners not to act like the murderous tenants in the vineyard. Instead he exhorts them to produce the kind of fruit that will lead them to the kingdom of God.



EXPOSITION: people kneel as priest brings Holy Eucharist to the altar and place Blessed Sacrament in monstrance. *O salutaris Hostia* is sung.
ADORATION: pray; read scripture, recite Rosary.
BENEDICTION: priest goes to the altar, genuflects, kneels, incense Blessed Sacrament; *Tantum Ergo* is sung. Priest leads people in prayer. After prayer, priest dons humeral veil, goes to altar, takes up the monstrance, turn towards the congregation. Elevating monstrance, priest solemnly blesses people by slowly making the sign of the cross with Blessed Sacrament; returns, kneels and leads Divine Phrases.
REPOSITION: hymn *Holy God, we Praise Thy Name* is sung. The priest goes to the altar, genuflects, removes the Blessed Sacrament from the monstrance, places it in the pyx. He goes to the tabernacle to repose the Blessed Sacrament within it; withdraw to sacristy.

October 11. Saint John XXIII: born Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli, of farming family in northern Italy; ordained priest 1904; after serving in World War I as a stretcher-bearer, he was later made national director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. 1925 became papal diplomat, serving in Bulgaria, Turkey, and in France. With help of Germany's ambassador to Turkey, Roncalli helped save estimated 24,000 Jewish people during World War II. Named cardinal, appointed patriarch of Venice 1953; elected pope 1958; took name John after his father and two patrons of Rome's cathedral. His feast day, 11 October, recalls the day of the first session of the Second Vatican Council 1962. Declared a Blessed in 2000, was canonized, together with Pope John Paul II, by Pope Francis 2014.
