Devotions & Teachings

WHAT IS FIRST FRIDAY?

"First Friday" is the first Friday of the month and is often marked by special devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus since Jesus died for us and won our salvation on a Friday.

At the end of the 17th century Our Lord appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alcoque (1647-1690) and asked her to spread devotion to His Most Sacred Heart. In a letter written to her Mother Superior in May 1688, St. Margaret Mary set out what is called The Great Promise Our Lord made regarding the Nine First Fridays and what we must do to earn it:

1. Attend Holy Mass.
2. Receive Communion.
3. Go to Confession.



WHAT IS FIRST SATURDAY?

Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary developed alongside devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The heart of Mary mirrors the heart of Jesus both in great love and in sharing His suffering. This devotion increased after the appearances of the Blessed Mother to three children of Fátima, Portugal, early in the twentieth century. The Blessed Mother told the eldest of the children that she would "assist at the hour of death with all the graces necessary for the salvation of their souls" all who, for five months, on the first Saturday of each month:

1. Confess their sins.
2. Receive Holy Communion.
3. Recite the Rosary.
4. And keep Mary company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary.

EXPOSITION: people kneel as priest brings Holy Eucharist to the altar and place Blessed Sacrament in monstrance. *O salutaris Hostia* is sung.

ADORATION: pray; read scripture, recite Rosary.

BENEDICTION: priest goes to the altar, genuflects, kneels, incense Blessed Sacrament; *Tantum Ergo* is sung. Priest leads people in prayer. After prayer, priest dons humeral veil, goes to altar, takes up the monstrance, turn towards the congregation. Elevating monstrance, priest solemnly blesses people by slowly making the sign of the cross with Blessed Sacrament; returns, kneels and leads Divine Phrases.

REPOSITION: hymn *Holy God, we Praise Thy Name* is sung. The priest goes to the altar, genuflects, removes the Blessed Sacrament from the monstrance, places it in the pyx. He goes to the tabernacle to repose the Blessed Sacrament within it; withdraw to sacristy.

Saint Faustine Kowalska: born in Poland; professed her first religious vows in the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. Beginning in 1924 and through out her life, reported having visions of Jesus and conversations with him, she noted in her diary.

Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos: born in Germany; entered Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer and sent to North America. Ordained priest in 1844, began his pastoral ministry in Pittsburgh as assistant pastor, serving also as Master of Novices and also dedicating himself to preaching; became full-time itinerant missionary,

preaching in both English and German in a number of different states.

Friday, October 6. **Saint Bruno:** celebrate teacher in Reims and close advisor to his former pupil, Pope Urban II; founded the mother house of the Carthusians; sought "to seek God assiduously, to find God promptly, and to possess God full" their motto "While the world changes, the Cross stands firm."



Friday, October 6

Blessed Marie Rose Durocher: born in Quebec; began first Canadian parish sodality for young women; founded Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary for Christian education.

GOD'S WAYS



In the stream of readings during this portion of Ordinary Time one week's texts can often appear to pick up exactly where the previous week's concluded. The sentiments expressed in today's first reading seem to be a direct reaction to the Gospel passage we heard last week. In that Gospel, the landowner pays the same wages to his workers whether they worked for a full day or for only a few minutes. Today Ezekiel gives us the lament, "The LORD's way is not fair!" (Ezekiel 18:25). These Sundays in Ordinary Time offer us a glimpse into the ways of the Lord. We see how God's way has the tendency to turn the accepted conventions of the day upside

down. Those who always expected that their way to heaven was guaranteed are disappointed. Those who thought they never had a chance are given that chance. Today offers us another opportunity to discover the abundance of God's mercy and love.
