





Tuesday, October 17. **Saint Ignatius of Antioch:** Apostolic Father known as the second successor of St. Peter in Antioch; wrote seven letters to local communities on church unity and structure, esp., the monoepiscopacy; first to use the term “Catholic Church” as a collective designation for Christians. *“We are not asked merely to call ourselves Christians; we are asked to be Christians through our deeds”*



Wednesday, October 18. **Saint Luke the Evangelist:** Syrian physician from Antioch and companions of St. Paul; authored Acts of the Apostles and a gospel; for gentile Christians which speaks of God’s mercy, universal salvation, love of the poor and the marginalized, absolute renunciation, prayer, and the Holy Spirit; represented by a winged ox; patron of the medical profession, painters, artists, sculptors, and butchers. *“Remember the past, plan for the future, but live for today, because yesterday is gone and tomorrow may never come.*

Thursday, October 19. **Saints Jogues and Companions, Martyrs:** French Jesuit and oblate missionaries to the Hurons and Iroquois of North American; Isaac was tomahawked; John was savagely mutilated and slain; secondary patrons of Canada.



Friday, October 20. **Saint Paul of the Cross:** born in Liguria; renowned preacher and founder of the Passionists, who combine the apostolate of retreats and missions with penitential monasticism. *“Always remain quiet and calm in the shelter of God’s will, under the mighty protection of the Most High.”*
